



## **LATENESS**

- Scroll down to 'Sign-up for courses'
- 4. Select the 'Music Centre' option and select 'St Albans Music School' as your selected school
- Choose 'Short Courses/Workshops'
- 6. Click on Short courses/Workshop
- 7. Choose 'Fife Club' and 'Add to Basket'
- 8. Fill in the full details to complete registration. If you already have an account with us, you will then get the opportunity to login with your existing information

If your child continues to come along to the ensemble after the trial session, you will be invoiced for the ensemble.
